Friends of Max completes 20 years in 2023

When Novartis' Glivec burst upon the firmament of cancer therapy, a hitherto rare and fatal leukaemia was converted into a chronic, manageable condition. The access program put in place and handed over to The Max Foundation for management was one without any kind of precedent. Within no time hundreds of CML patients had been enrolled into the program; men, women, young adults and children coming from all socio-economic strata.

Very early in the program itself it was evident these patients and their families needed to have access to some sort of a safe and secure platform - to share and learn from one another and maximise the impact of patient support interventions. And so was born Friends of Max - 20 years ago to the day, the support group arm in India of The Max Foundation.

In these years indeed this group has grown from strength and today stands in the unique position of welcoming all CML & GIST patients into its fold offering the many support systems to them in which the initial group of members themselves found succour.

Our trained City Chapter Leaders are leading projects, our fundraiser Chai for Cancer has international recognition and begins Season 10 this year and FOM is supporting other fledgling groups in the region like Max ko Saathi in Nepal, CML Collectives in Sri Lanka and Bangladesh CML Supporting Group in Bangladesh.

So last week in just one day the Treasurer and I, the Managing Trustee signed 62 cheques totalling to around 5 lakhs. This amount was completely raised by Chai for Cancer and went towards covering costs of diagnostic tests and school fees of little CML patients.

Over 150 patients attended the first ever meeting held for CML patients who up to now have not been part of any access program, have no access to any support group and who are on generics mostly supplied through the government agencies. Compliance is a major issue with these patients; one of the reasons being erratic supply of the drug and financial constraints. The meeting was organised on the request of Dr P K Jayachandran, Associate Professor, Medical Oncology, Adyar Cancer Institute in Chennai.
